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Il our three verticals have been active during the quarter, Kuchh Aur more than the others. Since

our staff member in charge of Kuchh Aur has been on leave for delivery (she has recently resigned from service) the services of Sayali Kadam, Project Manager of "Youth For Governance" (YFG) were loaned to Kuchh Aur two days in a week.

Sayali has proved her mettle with young children in schools and Kuchh Aur has got a big boost thereby. Our Trustee, Rekha Shahani, with Sayali to help her, has instilled essential values in the children and also introduced them to Cyber Safety.

Three of our Staffers attended the 30th Anniversary of "Education Today, Society Tomorrow" at Asia Plateau, Panchgani. They were exposed to new ideas which will stand them in good stead in our Kuchh Aur and YFG projects. Interns attending our RTI Awareness programmes were introduced to the Kuchh Aur classes. Their feedback will also help us to perform better.

Our YFG Project Manager with the active assistance of our Consultant, Advocate Shivam Jain Kakadia, is introducing colleges affiliated to us through their NSS units, to Parliamentary practices and procedures. Shivam has been enlightening students on the Indian Constitution with emphasis on the Preamble, Basic Rights and Duties of Citizens and all that is essential for citizens to know about our Constitution.

On Constitution Day 26th November PCGT's YFG organized a Quiz and also a Webinar to increase awareness about the Constitution among College youth.

One of our three Founding Trustees, Dr. Raj Kumar Anand, whose passion is Communal Harmony, addressed college students in Kelkar College on the subject and later distributed postcards bearing the Mohalla Committees Movement logo of four young men representing four of the different religions practiced in the country, Hinduism, Islam, Sikhism and Christianity with the message "Hum Sab Ek Hain". Dr. Anand has spoken of Communal Peace to gatherings of students in various Colleges of Mumbai under the aegis of PCGT.

The YFG's Campus Ambassador programme is active in the Colleges which interact with PCGT in the city. The Campus Ambassador arranges lectures for students on topics chosen by the students themselves. If requested PCGT Trustees help out with speakers on subjects in which they are knowledgeable. PCGT arranged a rural visit for some Campus and Lead Ambassadors to Rajgurunagar in the Khed Taluka of Pune District. Dr. Madhav Sathe, Secretary of the Bombay Mothers and Children Society arranged the visit as he does annually. City-bred youth are exposed to rural life and learn of the hardships experienced by the poorer inhabitants of our country.

On Human Rights Day, observed on 10th December every year, PCGT's Staff and N.S.S. volunteers of V.K. Krishna Menon College, Bhandup, organized a Street Play near Bhandup Railway Station. The play focused on the Right to Education and other rights that ordinary human beings expect.

Our month-long Internship Programme lays emphasis on the Right to Information Act and more recently on the Right to Service Act legislated in Maharashtra. Many of the Interns are students of Law. They are happy to learn of the RTI which enables common citizens to fight corruption. Quite a few of our past Interns have used the provisions of the Act in their own neighbourhood to good effect. They are in touch with our Consultant, Mr. Ranga Rao, who lectures to them on the RTI and introduces them to its practical usage.

PCGT has been successful in shaping more responsible and knowledgeable citizens. For this we are truly proud.

KUCHH AUR

G eal leaders are ordinary people with extraordinary determination." Some people believe that talent and a winning attitude are all you need in order to succeed in your endeavors, but a winning attitude means having determination, which many people lack. Kuchh Aur spoke about the value 'Determination' in schools. Examples of great personalities who challenged their difficulties and worked towards their goals were shared with the children.

'Respect and Dignity' was introduced in schools. It was explained to the children that every individual, irrespective of gender, race and culture is born with equal right to respect, in order to maintain their dignity. A person strives to be respected and valued throughout their life. However, in the environment where we live, sometimes we, as human beings, intentionally or unintentionally break this basic principle of respect and split individual dignity into spatial elements. Students were given examples of what happens if a person is mentally ill and faced disrespect in front of others.

Home and school are the places where a child learns moral ethics. Thus, Kuchh Aur ensured to include some essential habits and practices to keep a child close to morality and included a session on honesty. Discussions were held on how 'Honesty' plays an important role in everyone's life. At the end of the session many students took a pledge to be honest.

- "I will always tell the truth no matter what".
- "I will admit and take full responsibility when I am wrong.
- "I will do my own work and if I use someone else's work I will give them credit for the work they did".
- "I will not cheat during exams or in any other work".
- "I will be honest and trustworthy with family, friends and everyone in my life".

Awareness on Cyber Safety was explained to the students in schools. Most of them were aware about cyber crimes. Examples of cyber safety, cyber bullying and trolling, picture morphing, profile hacking, online game addiction, fake call and messages to ask for OTPs and bank details were discussed with them.



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WEBINAR ON HUMAN RIGHTS

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Webinar on the topic "All Human Rights are Fundamental Rights" was organized by Public Concern for Governance Trust in association with the NSS Unit of V. K. Krishna Menon College, Bhandup on December 10, 2022. The webinar was delivered by Adv. Shivam Jain Kakadia, who gave a brief history of human rights commencing in ancient India to Magna Carta along with a brief overview of the UDHR. He then discussed right to life, right to equality, prohibition of discrimination on grounds of religion, race, caste, sex or place of birth, etc. as enshrined in Part III of the Constitution and emphasized on how the judiciary has read various human rights into the fundamental rights guaranteed by the Constitution, giving broad interpretation to the latter. Around 60 NSS volunteers of V. K. Krishna Menon College participated in the webinar and it was successfully executed with the assistance of PCGT Campus Ambassador Ms. Pooja Pandey.
