To strive for good governance, contain corruption, uphold and inculcate values and enhance *Sadbhavna* in the citizens.

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

NEW IDEAS AND NEW BLOOD

Mr. D. Sivanandhan, the incoming Chairman of P.C.G.T. took charge of the office from Mr.

V.P. Raja on 18th January 2024. He began his term by inducting a new Project Manager who is going to oversee the entire gamut of projects run by the N.G.O. He is Swapnil Shirsat, a product of the College of Social Work, Nirmala Niketan. He comes with ten years of experience in social work and is brimming with new ideas.

Swapnil joined on February 8, 2024. In the two months he has been with PCGT he touched base with N.S.S. units of three colleges and signed MoUs with them. He also visited four other colleges to rope them in for our month-long Internship programme which is available every month whenever there is a demand.

Swapnil has planned to involve the N.S.S. in a Traffic Awareness Campaign in the city. Two-wheelers routinely break traffic signals and ride on the wrong side of the road. The danger involved in such driving will be dinned into our student friends with the active help of the city Traffic Police's Education unit. Swapnil has met the Traffic Chief. Through his good offices Swapnil met with Sr. Inspector Rajani Salunkhe of the Education Branch and discussed details of his plan with her. She told him of what was feasible. They have now to work on the details.

Three of our Trustees are women. Ana Saldanha and Rekha Shahani supervise the YFG and Kuchh Aur verticals, respectively. They are both very active. PCGT owes them a debt of gratitude. In fact Ana was feted for her work in YFG by the D. Y. Patil College of Law (a deemed

University) located in Navi Mumbai on the occasion of International Women's Day on 8th March 2024. Retired Justice Indra Bannerjee of the Supreme Court was the Chief Guest who presented her with the Award.

With the active help of Swapnil our two lady Trustees are formulating plans to raise the level of our involvement with college and school students to mould them into better citizens of our great country.

Kuchh Aur needs to touch base with more schools in the city. Municipal schools are being approached. YFG needs to involve college students in public services. With that end in sight Swapnil's move to educate students in traffic laws and etiquette is the right way to proceed. Involving the Traffic Police in this project is mandatory. Only the Traffic Police can permit our N.S.S. students to come out onto the roads if they are to convince students to obey the traffic laws.

The PCGT's Leadership programme has been a success over the past few years. At the helm we are blessed to have Adv. Shivam Jain Kakadia who, in his capacity of a Consultant, has organized the Annual National Youth Parliament very successfully. By selecting Ambassadors in every campus affiliated to PCGT he has taken PCGT's philosophy to the colleges. The Webinar series he arranged from January to March this year, in collaboration with the National Federation of Societies for Fast Justice, attracted fifty students. These boys and girls got the opportunity of listening to retired judges and other experts on legal topics in order to broaden their knowledge and form their own opinion on the topic discussed.

In collaboration with the Maharashtra National Law University (M.N.L.U.) PCGT enabled fifty other students to attend a workshop on "Justice to Juvenile: A Legal Insight". This was organized as part of PCGT's Constitutional Literacy Programme.

Getting College and School students introduced to our Constitution is an important part of our work. PCGT is committed to educating youth on the salient features of our Constitution. The rights that citizens enjoy due to its provisions and also the duties enjoined on them should be known to each and every educated citizen. PCGT has zeroed in to this necessity. Knowledge of the Constitution will make our youth better citizens of the future.

To address the Funds crunch Adv. Shivam Jain Kakadia, partnered by me, approached six leading lawyers of the Bombay Bar. We thank Mr. Darius Khambatta, Mr. Janak Dwarkadas, Mr. Navroz Seervai, Mrs. Mrinalini Deshmukh, Mr. Pradeep Sancheti and Mr. Iqbal Chagla for donating generously to our cause. Like we do with our other donors we will inform them of our activities on which their money was spent. This information is circulated through our Quarterly Newsletter.

The Annual Closing Function was organized at the Shanmukhananda Hall in Matunga on 8th February, 2024. The Police Commissioner, Vivek Phansalkar, gave a very relevant motivational speech on the occasion. So did the actor-activist Rahul Bose who was the other Guest of Honour. In their speeches they encouraged the 1400 School and College students present to excel in whatever they decide to do in life, to be curious to acquire knowledge and to follow the values inculcated in them by their parents at home and by their teachers in their schools and colleges.

KUCHH AUR

KUCHH AUR

Sessions in Communities

At the Mandala Center in the Mankhurd community, there were sessions to talk about Gender Equality. Students talked about what they think about boys and girls being equal. They also watched four videos about this topic. The students took part eagerly and said they believe boys and girls are equal and can do the same things. The session said it's important to change how we think about equality and to include everyone. This way of learning didn't just check what the students knew but also made it easier to talk openly about gender equality.

In Sambhaji Nagar, Rabale, a session on Cleanliness commenced with an introduction to PCGT and the Kuchh Aur initiative, followed by the facilitator's introduction. An energizing activity refreshed the students' mood, after which they observed their surroundings, discussing the importance of cleanliness and its impact. The negative effects of not being clean were also explored, with students encouraged to share their thoughts and key takeaways to conclude the session.

Students were then prompted to share their opinions, enriching their understanding of the topic's significance and enhancing their overall learning experience.

Tasks included assisting friends, making new acquaintances, aiding their parents, and engaging in respectful communication. The session concluded with students expressing their enthusiasm for similar activities in future sessions and providing insightful feedback. Key learnings from the session included the importance of honesty, empathy, and actively helping others, fostering a sense of responsibility and community among the students.

effective studying, and the value of relaxation. In summary, it proved to be an enlightening and captivating experience for all students.

Workshop and Panel Discussion on "Justice to Juvenile: A Legal Insight"

Public Concern for Governance Trust (PCGT) in collaboration with Maharashtra National Law University Mumbai (MNLU) Centre for Women, Child Rights, and Gender Justice, Centre for Research in Criminal Justice (CRCJ) and the Academy for Development Legal Studies organized a Workshop on "Justice to Juvenile: A Legal Insight" on 13th January, 2024 at MNLU, Powai, Mumbai.

Our Chairman Shri D. Sivanandhan was the Chief Guest at the Workshop and the Panel of Speakers included Adv. Anil Malhotra (Legal analyst, IAFL Fellow, Author and Advocate); Adv. Nandini Thakkar (Head lead, Anti-trafficking Initiatives); Mr. Siddharth Pillai (Co-founder & Director of RATI Foundation); Ms. Priti Patkar (Co-founder of Prerana Foundation); Dr. Harish Shetty (Child psychiatrist); and Ms. Urmila Jadhav (JJB Member, Mumbai).

Adv. Persis Sidhva and Adv. Priyanka Patil moderated the panel discussion. The workshop was conducted as a part of PCGT's Constitutional Literacy programme, with a focus on two themes – "Irreversible Hindu Adoption & Legality of Challenges Posed by CARA & Adoption Regulations 2022 - Child Trafficking" and "Juvenile Justice Act 2015 Child in need of Care & Protection & Child in conflict in Law." More than 50 students attended the programme, including 20 Interns from PCGT (January 2024 batch).



Public Concern for Governance Trust (PCGT) in collaboration with Maharashtra National Law University Mumbai (MNLU) Centre for Women, Child Rights, and Gender Justice and Majlis Legal Centre organized a Workshop and Panel Discussion on "My Body, My Choice - Reproductive Autonomy and Rights of Women in India" on March 16, 2024 at MNLU, Powai, Mumbai.

Our Trustee Adv. Abha Singh was the Keynote Speaker in the Workshop and Panel Discussion. Adv. Flavia Agnis (Founder, Majlis Legal Centre) was the Chief Guest and the Panel of Speakers included Adv. Audrey Dmello (Director, Majlis Legal Centre); Dr. Amar Jesani (Co-founder and Editor of Indian Journal of Medical Ethics); Dr. Suchitra Dalvie (Gynaecologist and Coordinator at Asia Safe Abortion Partnership) and

The workshop was conducted as a part of PCGT's Constitutional Literacy programme, with a focus on empowering women through education about abortion rights, access to contraception, and policy advocacy and raising awareness about the importance of reproductive rights in general. RTI WORKSHOPS

A workshop on the Right to Information Act (RTI) was organized by Public Concern for Governance Trust (PCGT) in collaboration with SVKM's Pravin Gandhi College of Law, Mumbai (PGCL) on Saturday, 9th March 2024 from 8 am to 10 am at PGCL Campus, Vile Parle. The workshop was delivered by Adv. Shivam Jain Kakadia, who explained the theoretical and practical aspects of the RTI Act 2005, including drafting of RTI Applications. More than 50 students of PGCL participated in the session and it was included in the

Guest Lecture Series of PGCL which focuses on practical learning in law.

An online session on RTI was also organized in collaboration with SVKM's Jitendra Chauhan College of Law, Mumbai (JCCL) on 23rd February 2024 from 4 pm to 6 pm as a part of their DPC Lecture Series. It was delivered by Adv. Shivam Jain Kakadia and saw participation of more than 50 students who gained theoretical as well as practical knowledge about the law governing RTI in India.
